Exploring new territory

Watch out for Dublin-born harpist Maria Cleary's debut CD on the music of Louis Spohr. It is the first complete Louis Spohr CD using original instruments, and more importantly employing historically informed practises, including improvisation and elaboration, historical techniques, and using the manuscript or first prints as sources. Like much music for harp of the 18th and 19th centuries, the original scores have been edited and revised so many times throughout the last centuries, there remains little of the original music. This is also the first recording of Spohr's music on original instruments. Maria, who is a free-lance harpist specialising in the historical harps, from the medieval to the single-action harp, plays two single-action harps (J. Erat, G. Cousineau) from the 18th century and Davide Monti (Italy) uses a violin also from the 18th century with a similar set-up as Spohr's own violin.

The International Harp Competition & Festival, The Netherlands will take place in Utrecht from 23rd to 27th March 2010. For the first time, an international harp competition & festival will be organised in the Netherlands. Founded by students, and supported by the *Dutch Harp Society* and the *Utrechts Conservatorium*, this event promises to be a whole new approach to pedal harp competitions. Jury members will give masterclasses and recitals. One such performance will be given by jury member Anne-Marie O'Farrell who will perform repertoire from her most recent album, *Just So Bach*. St Patrick's Day provides harpists with many settings in which to perform and Ireland's National Museum in Kildare Street is one of these. Storyteller Nuala Hayes and harpist/composer Anne-Marie O'Farrell present 'Cailleach: The Wilder Wisdom of Auld Ones' which captures the many sided personality of the cailleach: wise woman, healer, goddess, nun, witch. The presentation combines stories and poems with traditional and newly composed music and has been grant-aided by the Arts Council's Deis Scheme.

Salvi harps are currently working on the design and production of a recital lever harp which is a realistic size for air travel. It is to be a modified version of the Donegal model with a range from low A to high G and prototypes are due to be ready in late spring.
